How do you know which plants are drought tolerant? The internet is deceptive and even nurseries may give inappropriate information. Luckily, in California we have an updated plant list called WUCOLS IV (Water Use Classification of Landscape Species, 4th version!) and an excellent free online app which helps us hydrozone (irrigate plants with other plants that need the same amount of water). It is www.waterwonk.us.

Remember that not all California natives are drought tolerant. And many non-natives are drought tolerant.

Don't forget that many low water edible trees can be added into the landscape also!
