Position Title: Street Lighting Technician	Job Family: 6
General Classification: Front-Line	Job Grade: 18

Definition: To provide field maintenance of the City's streetlights, including trouble-shooting and repair of streetlight circuits and operations.

Distinguishing Characteristics: This is a journey level technical classification. General supervision is provided by the Streets Supervisor or other higher level management classification.

Examples of Duties: Duties may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Inspect, remove and repair streetlight fixtures and standards.
- 2. Diagnose streetlight malfunctions; adjusts, replaces and modifies electrical and mechanical components.
- 3. Ability to read 701 maps and record modifications or changes to existing City maps.
- 4. Investigate complaints and reports of streetlight malfunctions, perform nighttime or predawn inspections for streetlight outages.
- 5. Assist in the design of electrical circuits and systems for street lighting.
- 6. Inspect the work of electrical contractors during the course of streetlight construction.
- 7. Relamp streetlights.
- 8. Assist in preparing plans and specifications for street lighting, including traffic control.
- 9. Check poles for structural integrity and paint streetlight poles and signal standards.
- 10. Keep accurate work records on computer, order supplies, parts, materials and billing invoices.
- 11. Perform other related duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications:

<u>Knowledge of</u>: Theory and principles of electrical and electronic equipment and circuits; tools and equipment used to repair, maintain and troubleshoot lighting systems; occupational hazards standard safety precautions and computer data entry.

Ability to: Test and repair of electrical and electronic equipment and installations; perform duties while elevated above traffic in basket of a boom truck at heights up to 30'; read and interpret plans, specifications, blueprints, schematics and manuals; work at odd and regular hours as required; work with minimal supervision; develop maintenance schedules using a computer and organize parts and tools.

Experience and Training Guidelines: Any combination of experience and training will qualify if it provides for the required knowledge and abilities.

<u>Recommended</u>: Two years of experience in electrical/electronic repair or inspection work; equivalent to the completion of the 12th grade supplemented by technical trade courses in electronic repair.

Required Licenses or Certificates: Possession of a valid Class "B" California driver's license at the time of appointment and have knowledge of the safety procedures required to operate specialized equipment, e.g., boom truck.
