Position Title: Equipment Maintenance Supervisor	Job Family: III
General Classification: Professional	Job Grade: 19

Definition: To plan, organize, direct, and supervise vehicle and equipment maintenance operations within the Public Works Department and to perform a variety of technical tasks relative to assigned area of responsibility.

Supervision Received and Exercised: Receives direction from the Fleet and Facilities Manager; exercises direct and indirect supervision over assigned technical and maintenance personnel.

Examples of Duties: Duties may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Plan, prioritize, assign, supervise, and review the work of Equipment Mechanic staff involved in the repair, maintenance, and servicing of all City-owned and operated vehicles and equipment.
- 2. Recommend and assist in the implementation of goals and objectives; establish schedules and methods for preventive maintenance and replacement of all Cityowned equipment; implement policies and procedures.
- 3. Evaluate operations and activities of assigned responsibilities; recommend improvements and modifications; prepare various reports on operations and activities.
- 4. Participate in budget preparation and administration; prepare cost estimates for budget recommendations; submit justifications for additional materials and personnel; monitor and control expenditure.
- 5. Participate in the selection of staff; provide or coordinate staff training; work with employees to correct deficiencies; implement discipline procedures.
- 6. Answer questions and provide information to the other operating departments; investigate complaints and recommend corrective action as necessary to resolve complaints.
- 7. Perform other duties as assigned.

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Minimum Qualifications:

Knowledge of: Principles and practices of automotive and heavy and light equipment maintenance and repair; equipment, tools, and materials used in repair and maintenance of vehicles and equipment maintained by the City; principles of supervision, training, and performance evaluation; tools and equipment necessary for the repair and upkeep of City-owned equipment; basic mechanics of gasoline, diesel, and natural gas engine repair, including electrical systems, pump mechanics, hydraulics, and brake systems; principles and practices of safety management; principles of municipal budgeting administration; pertinent local, State, and Federal laws, ordinances, and rules.

Ability to: Organize, implement, and direct the Fleet and Equipment Services operation/activities; estimate time and material cost of vehicle and equipment repair; assist in the development and monitoring of the Fleet and Equipment Services budget; develop and recommend policies and procedures related to assigned operations; establish and maintain effective working relationships with those contacted in the course of work; communicate clearly and concisely, both orally and in writing; and supervise, train, and evaluate assigned staff.

Experience and Training Guidelines: Combination of relevant experience, education, and training that will satisfy the required minimum qualifications, knowledge, and abilities.

Three years of increasingly responsible experience at the journey level in the repair and maintenance of motorized vehicles and equipment, including one year of Lead or Senior Mechanic responsibility. Training equivalent to a high school diploma supplemented by community college course work in equipment mechanic repair and supervisory management or the City's supervisory training course.

Required Licenses or Certificates: Possession of a valid California Class C Driver License. Possession of, or ability to obtain, a California Class B Driver License with HazMat and tanker endorsements is highly desirable.
