
Santa Clara County Public Health Revised Order Summary for Orange Tier

Requirements for ALL Businesses



- 1. Telework whenever possible.
- 2. New Social Distancing Protocol must be compelled within 14 days of the Revised Health Order going into effect.
- 3. All positive test results must be reported to the County within four hours.

Latest County Public Health Orders

- Goes into effect on Oct. 14
- Capacity limitations are stricter at County level
- Businesses to submit revised Social Distancing Protocols
- Continue to wear masks, socially distance and stay home when possible
