Community Engagement Objectives

- Provide a comfortable space for sharing personal stories that increase visibility and understanding of local police interaction with the community
- Gather information for an HRC report to the Mountain View Police Department and City Council to help inform future police policy and programs

Community Engagement Process

- Participants included Mountain View residents, workers and visitors who had personal experience interacting with Mountain View Police
- Stories collected through:
 - Virtual Listening Forums with small group discussion
 - Written stories submitted on a website portal
 - One-on-one interviews
- Community report out and reflection on themes from the stories

Expressions of Satisfaction

- General expressions of satisfaction (29 mentions)
- Positive community relations (21 mentions)
- Helpful police assistance (12 mentions)
- Pleasant police interactions (10 mentions)
- Feeling of safety from police presence (7 mentions)
- Positive school environment with SRO (3 mentions)

Expressions of Concern/Need for Improvement

- Domineering police behavior (43 mentions)
- Race-based/biased policing (42 mentions)
- Police not the appropriate personnel (41 mentions)
- Need for police training (35 mentions)
- Lack of trust in the police (34 mentions)
- Negative community relations (27 mentions)
- Need for police accountability/transparency (23 mentions)
- Community bias leading to unnecessary police response (8 mentions)
- Unnecessary use of force (7 mentions)
- Unnecessary ticketing (6 mentions)
